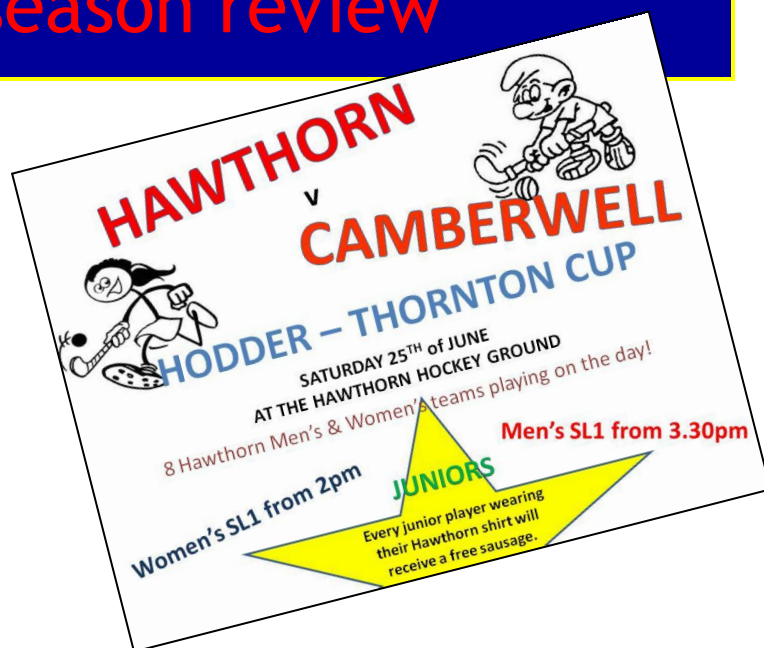

Reviews or Reports

Men's State League 1

- Review

It has been a very exciting time for the Men's State League squad in the first half of the 2011 season. After the well documented departure of 6 regular State League players from 2010, the responsibility was given to a number of new faces to step up and fill the void. At the halfway mark, the team sits in fourth place with 5 wins and 4 losses, but it's the way the Hawks have gone about it that has been most impressive.

The start of the season saw coach Jonathan Stebbings miss a few games after hanging out with too many St. Kilda players and catching the "kissing disease". While a massive loss to the team, he was able to take control of the team from the sideline which was extremely valuable for the younger players in the group. Captain James Osborne was also providing strong leadership for his young defence which has conceded less than 2 goals a game so far.

This season has seen the introduction of many new faces to the regular line up for the Hawks. Michael Metz, Steve Jenkins, Charlie Chessel, Charlie Cross and Rory Loder have become permanent fixtures in the team and their improvement is one of the

The Hawks have used 19 players so far this season with Steve Jenkins, Alex Cross, Chris Kings, Adam Foster, Matt Storer and Rob Kilpatrick all making their debuts this season. This weekend's game sees another Hawk, goalkeeper Craig Hardman, make his debut, and Pat Moore's good form in pennant A has seen him rewarded with his first game for the year.

It has also been great to see so many players in the Squad being rewarded with representative duties. So far this year the following players have had representative duties:

- George Bazeley has represented Australia and the Victorian Vikings
- Johan Durst played for the Australian Youth Team against Malaysia, and will make his debut for the Victorian Vikings this weekend, as well as being selected in the Vic Under 21 team

- Tom Sinclair selected in the Victorian Under 21 Team
- Rory Loder selected in the Under 18 Victorian Team
- Charlie Cross selected in the Futures Squad this weekend in Tasmania
- Charlie Chessel (better known as the Gov.) represented Hawthorn in the Bridge-to-Bridge run around Lake Burley Griffen

While the season so far for the Hawks has been positive, they are not satisfied with what they have achieved. They will be looking to build on their accomplishments so far and keep pushing towards the top of the ladder. They are looking to build a winning culture amongst the young players, and the best way to do that is by winning! The next chance for them to do this is on Saturday against Camberwell in the second leg of the Hodder-Thornton Cup. Men's Pennant C - Review

At the mid-point of the season Pennant C finds itself currently sitting in 5th position, 1 point behind 4th and 4 points behind 2nd. Pennant C has produced a season highlighted by inconsistent performances. In the opening match of the season we went down to Camberwell 3-1, despite our far superior number of circle penetrations.

Following this the team placed a focus on finishing and we managed to rack up three consecutive wins against Greensborough, Monash and Doncaster. Sam Fairbrother in particular dominated at this point in the season by scoring 8 goals in 3 matches. This domination unfortunately lured Charlie Tulloch to



snatch our prized goal scorer, meaning Pennant C had once again become impotent. This inability to generate scoreboard pressure resulted in an absolute smashing by an experienced Melbourne Uni team in Round 5.

Re-gathering after the loss the boys put together a great performance to smash 4th placed Essendon 6-1. This was the team's most complete performance to date with all members of the team playing at a high level. In rounds 7 and 8 we had two narrow losses 2-1 to Altona and Kew. These results were particularly disappointing for the team as we fell out of the 4, and in both games the team did not function as a unit as effectively as it had at other points in the year.

Finally in round 9 Pennant C came up against 2nd placed Mentone.

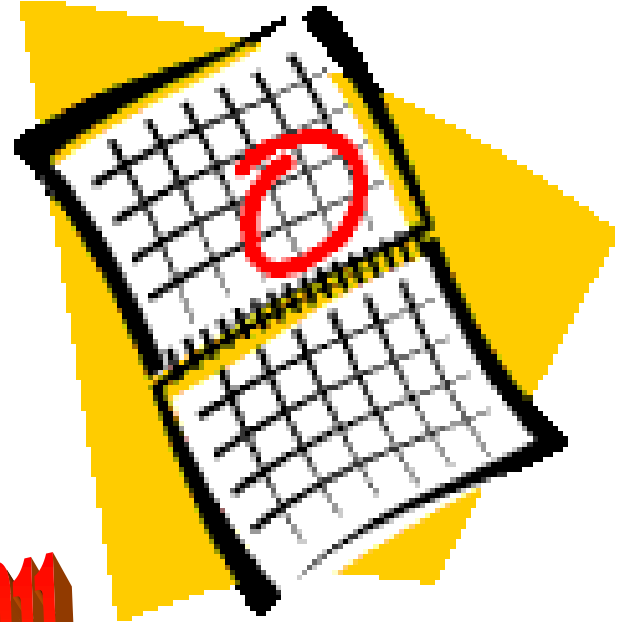

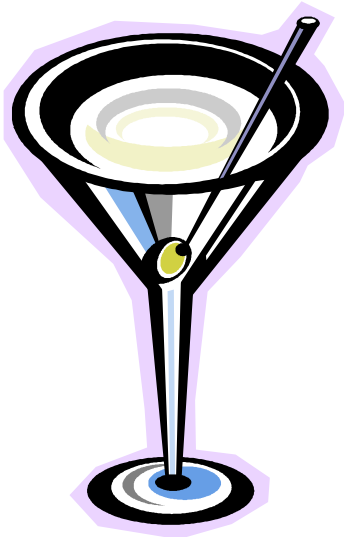
