HHC President's Report AGM 2017

It has been another reasonably successful year for Hawthorn Hockey Club, both on and off the field.

The various divisional reports will discuss the on field performance in more detail, but for me the highlight was the back to back win of the Women's Premier League team, winning both last year's and now this year's Premier League Grand Final. This team is now our most successful top team since the Women's Division formed. The highlight however was the fact that we won the premierships in the 1st, 2nd and 3rd divisions of the competition. There were also premierships in the Juniors and Veterans divisions.

Off the field we remain financially responsible and in a good position. This is in no small part to our now long term treasurer, Jeremy Brown-Greaves.

My highlight off the field was the presentation night in October at the Royal South Yarra Tennis Club. This was a happy and entertaining night, had 2 marvellous hosts, and was fully subscribed.

To try and assess whether we are addressing the needs of all members of the club, this year we ran a member survey asking for comments on the things we do well, but also the things we either do not do well, or do not do at all.

We are still in the process of assessing the results, and a major part of our work next year will be to try and address concerns of members.

In general terms however, our major aims next year will be to continue to try our utmost to make sure that the club remains an inclusive club, welcoming all, of any ability, to play hockey in a safe environment and at a reasonable cost. The most important thing for a member is to enjoy playing hockey, and if they want to improve their skills they should be able to do so.

A major issue facing us in the medium term will be the lack of adequate ground time for both training and matches, for all divisions of the club, and in particular for Juniors.

The fact of the matter is that we have 2 reasonably large clubs sharing 2 grounds. League entry criteria (LEC) now dictate that we must have particular numbers of teams of various composition. This is almost impossible when there is effectively only one ground per club.

Despite considerable work being done on this, at present there is still no prospect of a third ground at our Centre, and no viable alternative at another site for either of our clubs.

Much more work and consideration will be involved in trying to deal with this as we proceed into 2018. I think it is the most serious issue facing our club, if we want to remain a Premier League Club, and we will continue to consult widely regarding a successful outcome.

There are so many people involved in running this club that I will probably forget to thank someone, and I apologise in advance if I have left anyone out.

First of all, I want to thank all of the Hawthorn Hockey Club Committee. They don't get many thanks, and people are quick to criticise at some small problem, but I thank them all: Di and Jeremy Brown-Greaves, Kamron Ley, Richard Ingram, Andrew Rook, John Robinson, Carole Shanks, Jeremy Harris and Mike Ryan.

Jeremy Harris and Carole Shanks in particular I commend. They have now retired from the Junior Division with a new President taking over at the end of 2017.

Kamron Ley deserves special plaudits for the way he has tirelessly worked with the Men's Division. He is retiring this year as work commitments are taking their toll. He will remain involved. He took over when the Men's Division was struggling to find a person to organise them and he has done a great job for some years.

I thank Andrew Rook, and Richard Ingram before him, for their work as secretary. Andrew worked tirelessly more recently on the junior recruitment programs.

Although I hope she is not retiring, Di Brown-Greaves also deserves a special plaudit, she has threatened to retire for a year or two now, but the Women's Division had a very successful year and this is in no small part due to Di's ability to ensure that, as much as possible, all requests and wishes are dealt with fairly and sensibly as we can. There are many competing demands and Di seems to know how to maximise the goodwill.

I want to thank our 3 HMHC Directors. The Centre is run by 3 directors from each of the two clubs. Our directors are Russell Kilroe-Smith, Richard Ingram and Chris Legge.

I would also like to thank, on behalf of the club, Linda and Grenville Dawson our canteen operators and general guardians of the Centre, Norm Walker who does the bookings, and Harry Buring, our maintenance manager, for without these 4 people, the Centre would be nowhere near as welcoming or run as well as it, for the most part, does.

Finally, I wish all club members a very happy Christmas and we look forward to the next year to be better than ever.

The role of the Hawthorn-Malvern Hockey Centre management committee is to ensure the club house, grounds and surrounds are maintained.

This year the major concern was the state of H-1. Despite considerable maintenance to H-1 it is evident it is coming to the end of its life and we are looking at replacing it at the end of 2018.

H-2 suffered minor fire damage. We are monitoring the state of the ground and will repair damage when required.

New concept plans for the redevelopment of the club house have been drawn up and will be on display for discussion and comment.

Whilst we understand the need for more Saturday availability for juniors, both clubs felt the contribution by Carey could not be risked and we have renewed the lease with Carey.

Efforts are being made to find a site and funds for a third ground.

We are costing changing lights to LED and hope to make the change in 2018.

A new technical bench was completed.

A new score board was installed.

Fence heights around both grounds have been raised, funding for this project was provided by the Federal Government.




Winter 2017 – Statistics






Figure 1: Hawks in Premiership winning Vipers and Vikings

2017 FINALS - Women's Premier League




2017 FINALS - Women's Premier League Reserves




2017 FINALS - Men's Premier League Reserves
