2025 President's Report

2025 was another year of development, resilience and success for the Hawthorn Hockey Club. Our players, coaches, volunteers, and supporters have once again shown what makes this club such a strong and welcoming community.

On field winter season success came from our 4 Premiership teams - Women's Pennant A, Men's Open BSE, Men's Masters 50+ HMHC (1) and Women's Masters 35 SE (Red). Congratulations also to our 7 other teams who made finals - Women's Premier League and Reserves, Men's Premier League Reserves, U18 Mixed (Red), U16 Boys Shield, U12 Mixed Pennant East and U12 Girls Pennant East. Our Women's 35+ team also became the inaugural 2025 ICC indoor 35+ premiers back in March 2025.

The club was thrilled to have 16 juniors selected for state and development teams, as well as 7 senior representatives playing Hockey One for HCM and Tassie Tigers, with a further 11 masters playing for Victoria. We also have 7 players currently in National squads. As a club, we are so proud of our elite players, but we are, at our heart, a club that offers hockey for all, at a wide variety of ability levels.

We remain committed to developing and offering high level, quality coaching to our players. As a club we are grateful to our coaching team, led by Director of Coaching Jeremy Edwards, for their commitment to player development and for fostering a positive culture across all grades. To all our coaches and international players, who provide training, skill development, game strategy and support to our 30+ teams every week from pre-season and throughout the season, a huge thank you.

Off field, we have continued to work predominantly across the following areas:

Sponsorship

Andrew Smith has worked tirelessly to find sponsors for the club. You will notice several new banners on both H-1 and H-2 - Bendigo Bank, Axton Finance, Just Hockey and Snap Fitness have all joined existing sponsors Melville Lawyers, ATF, Farm Implements, Auburn Hotel and ProVoltage. Our club celebrations of the Hockey Victoria Special Rounds - Womens, Mens, Indigenous and Pride Rounds - are annual opportunities for us to learn more, to promote inclusivity, to celebrate different communities, and honour and raise awareness for specific causes. Our special thanks this year to Lonsdale Solutions for sponsoring our new Pride Round shirts.

I would like to thank the committee for their tireless work behind the scenes. From organising fixtures and managing finances to liaising with HV, running events, organising uniform and assisting with communications club wide, your efforts do not go unnoticed. Thanks also to our umpire manager Edwina Oostergetel, umpires, team managers, and all volunteers who contribute week in and week out.

Looking Ahead

As we look forward to 2026, our focus will be on strengthening our junior pathways, supporting our senior teams, and exploring opportunities to expand our membership base. We are also working on developing our communication in and around the club, including on social media and our website. Anyone who can provide some expertise in these areas should get in contact with me - the club cannot function and survive without volunteers, and any time and effort you can give us is greatly appreciated.

With the continued dedication of our players, coaches, and supporters, the future of Hawthorn Hockey Club looks bright.

2025 Treasurer's Report

Hawthorn Hockey Club faced some challenges and had some successes in FY25.

For many years we have benefited from the generous support of a number of benefactors who have supported our club, our coaches and a number of our key players. In FY25 that player support continued, but thanks to the enormous effort of a couple of individuals, we were also able to bring on a range of club sponsors.

What has been most exciting about bringing onboard sponsors, is not just the direct monetary contribution that was received, but the ongoing relationships that we are starting to build with them, and in the community more broadly. We are encouraging our members to interact and trade with our sponsors and have been pleased to welcome them to club events, to display their names with pride on our shirts, and on banners around the ground.

I would also like to acknowledge our pool of smaller sponsors, Coterie members and supporters whose contribution is less obvious – the shirt sponsors without logos, the businesses that give a % of our spend back or provided products, and the members who don't seek reimbursement for the umpire fees they paid. It all helps. Thank you.

Despite the sponsorship revenue coming in, FY25 had its challenges. We faced a 50% significant increases in Umpiring costs. The rate for , and ground hire went up by 10%, but we managed our non usage better than previous years. We were forced into making some tough decisions early in the winter season and across the summer and indoor competitions. We challenged ourselves to ensure the viability of teams – We did not commit a team without strong numbers to try and ensure fees or other sources would cover costs.

Similar to FY24, we tried to keep playing fee increases as low as possible, recognising the strain on members finances – unfortunately we still do not quite have the balance right, and are reflecting a shortfall again in FY25.

Once again I would like to thank everyone who has volunteered – Our members are better understanding the need to support the club and we are getting better at directing those efforts to add value to the club.

To sum up FY25, we were able to grow our sponsor base to offset a reduction in direct club donations. Whilst an improvement on FY24, we didn't manage enough to offset increasing costs and are again looking at a shortfall, this time of 5.4%. The committee are facing into this challenge and will continue to strive to maintain appropriate financial discipline to ensure the ongoing success of the club

- Focus on all teams achieving higher results, particularly in pennant grade.

2025 Women's Masters Report

Our section's highlights in 2025 were undoubtedly our 2 Pennants.

- Our Women's Masters Indoor team were crowned the inaugural ICC WM35+ Premiers after an unbeaten weekend of indoor hockey in March
- Our 35+ Red team became the WM35-SE 2025 premiers after an unbeaten winter season.

Our summer season in 2024 (Term 4) saw us field 2 outdoor teams in the 35s and 45s age groups. We also fielded 2 indoor teams, who finished 2nd and 5th respectively, and had a number of players trying out indoor for the first time.

In winter 2025 we again fielded 3 teams - 2 teams in the newly combined WM35-SE competition and one team in the WM45+ competition. As always, we benefitted from some new players joining us this season, and we were thrilled to see the return of several players from injury and pregnancy.

Our 45+ team unfortunately fell short in the final few games of the season and missed out on finals on goal difference. One unexpected loss early in the season and a few draws towards the end proved to be the team's downfall, but we enjoyed integrating several new players and we're all raring to go again next season!

Our 35 Blue team had a very tough season in the new combination 35+ league made up of teams from last year's A grade as well as the existing B grade teams. We have asked HV to separate WM35 into graded comps for 2026. Again, a few new (young) players joined our core group of players, strengthening the team across all lines. Everyone competed hard each week and several games were decided by a single goal, so there is plenty to build on for next season.

Our 35 Red team had an outstanding season in 2025. Boosted by the arrival of several new young masters, the team had a successful and high scoring season, finishing top of the ladder and reaching the Grand Final against Southern United, ending as well deserved premiers following a 4-1 victory. Across the season the 35 Reds scored 79 goals for and only conceded 12 - the team was dominant from season start to finish.

Hawthorn supplied 9 of our intrepid women to the various Victorian State masters teams this year - congrats to all of them. Further congratulations to Kate Stebbings and Nan Latta for their selection in the Australia 50+ team and Vicki Thomson in the Australia (2) 45+ team for next year's World Cup in Europe.

Overall, the Women's Masters year has been fun and very successful. It was great to have so many younger masters playing and to welcome lots of new players across a wide age range. We are always happy to welcome new players (regardless of age and ability!).

Over summer 2025 (Term 4) we are fielding 1 outdoor 45+ team and 1 indoor team, and we're all looking forward to next winter season.

HMHC GROUNDS AND PAVILION REPORT

OCT 2025

Below is an update on activities at HMHC Pavilion and Grounds.

Another successful winter season is over — the grounds held up, and the Pavilion (both Canteen/Kiosk and change rooms) were well used and appreciated by players and families, especially with Melbourne weather!

We have a number of projects underway in anticipation of a big 2026.

H-1 Lights

As many players have observed, the brightness of the lights on H-1 are below what is expected for matches. This is due to old age (lights now 6 years old), failure of some lights, significant water damage over time and some bird attacks.

HMHC has contracted Eco Electrical (who specialise in sports ground lighting) to do a complete refurbishment (costing in excess of \$100,000). All light fittings will be replaced (the number of fittings will be reduced due to increased light output per light fitting). All of the pole electrical components will be replaced, waterproofing will be enhanced and spikes added on top of the poles to stop bird attacks.

The lights on both grounds will be aligned properly.

H-2 Lights

H-2 lights, whilst not perfect, are in much better condition than H-1. ECO believe they can substantially improve the outcome by re-aligning the lights — some are way out. They will also waterproof the tops of the poles with spikey bird protection as well. It should buy us a few more years before a complete refurbishment is required.

H-2 manhole

A number of players have noted that there is a spot near the top of the circle on H-2 where the manhole (to the tank below) is raised. In fact, it is the rest of the pitch that has compacted and so is lower than the manhole.

Following a regular pitch grooming of H1 and H-2 in August 2025, TigerTurf will return in November to raise the area of the pitch on H-2 around the manhole to reduce the difference in levels.

A complete refurbishment of H-2 is beyond the reach of our cash reserves at this time.

Pavilion

The Pavilion has been well used this year. HMHC has now completed repairs to the 25% of the roof at the northern end that collapsed in April. The pavilion was empty at the time. The

contractors who fixed the roof were clear that the cause was incorrect installation previously. The plasterboard was not affixed properly to the roof steel. We were lucky that the rest did not collapse. The balance of the roof was resecured with appropriate additional screws etc.

The lighting was re-installed and the total roof repainted on 2 October. Job is now complete.

The contractors are providing us with a detailed letter to assist us in chasing recompense from the original Builder (about \$30,000). As with such things, there is no guarantee we will receive compensation, but are receiving (generously donated) legal advice to assist.

Water Pressure Issue

The water pressure is ok for the Kiosk/Canteen, Showers and Toilets. The issue at hand is that the water pressure to the fire hydrant for firefighting purposes is not enough. We have been arguing with Yarra Valley Water for 3 years now! The bottom line is they need to run a bigger pipe under Auburn Rd from the school side to our side. No small task! They finally agreed to do this to prevent us pursuing legal action and we can hope this is done before Xmas but it is YV Water!

Other Pavilion Issues

HMHC has 2 other main objectives for next year.

We want to obtain cabinets for the inside east wall so the clubs can display cups/flags/trophies etc. It is purely a cost issue — if anyone sights suitable 2nd hand cabinets for sale at a good price please contact me.

Secondly, we intend to install hot plates and a fryer in the canteen to enhance usage and operations.

Ground usage

Our ground usage has been very busy this year. There are very few spots available during term time, and the winter season is full. There is a big demand from schools in particular.

However, the KBH Brumbies have just opened a second ground at Elgar Rd this year. Brumbies and HMHC are the only venues that have 2 pitches in the East of Melbourne. There is a potential to lose some trade in 2026.

A few thanks are in order

Your current committee is Greg Suzor, Sam Hill, Matthew Hook, Geoff Daley, Sam Negri and me as Chairman. All members have pitched in to complete the tasks needed (ground hire, financial results, canteen operations etc). A good team.

Also thanks to Miranda Ellis who stood down after 5 years of service— a job well done.

A special thanks to Harry Buring, our maintenance man, ground cleaner, goals fixer, gardener, pavilion cleaner, and general dogs body. A very important cog in the wheel. Well done Harry— much appreciated by all.

Harry has personally undertaken to provide funds to HMHC by recycling cans under the deposit scheme. He is up to \$3,000 this year!

Many thanks also to Andrew Rook our Chief Technical Officer, who managed to keep the lights operating legally, the scoreboard working and the Square Cash Register functioning adding barcode readers to assist the canteen manager, amongst other duties. Well Done.

Also thanks to Vicki Lawler, our independent bookkeeper. Vicki handles the books, sets up payments, form fills back office red tape and presents a full set of accounts, all reconciled, every month. Well done Vicki.

And finally, to Kim Davie, our canteen/kiosk coordinator since late May 25. There has been a revolution in the canteen due to Kim. The canteen is much better organised and especially with the introduction of the coffee machine which has been a big success and profit maker. Kim is always thinking of presentation, what sells and what doesn't, and how to maximise profit by judicious purchasing. A fantastic contribution.

It should be clearly noted that the canteen only works with Hawthorn and TEM providing volunteers to staff the canteen. We have trialled a system in 2025 so that 25% of revenue goes back to the clubs based on who staffs the canteen. This is a major incentive for clubs to get volunteers. Talk to Kim as she has some good volunteer feedback which may help in 2026.

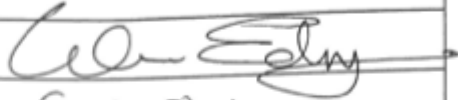
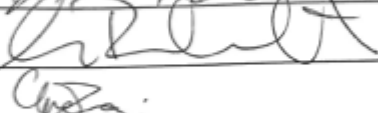
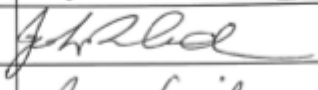
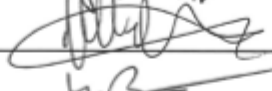
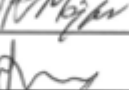
